Sandwell Council's cabinet member for culture and leisure,

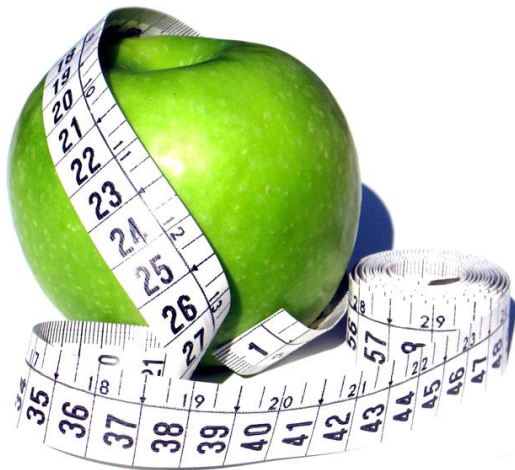

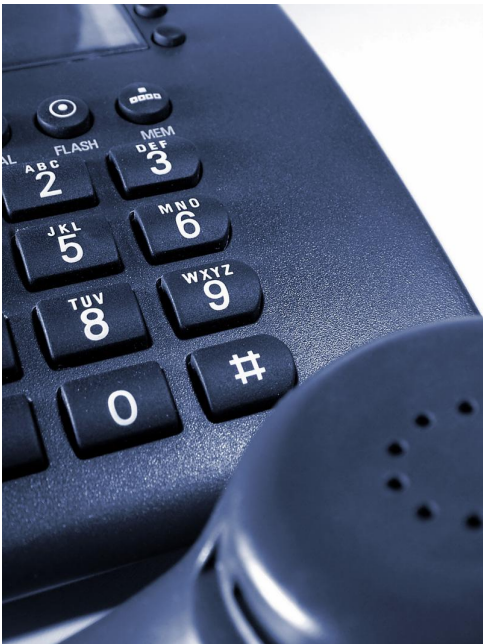


Friendship over the phone

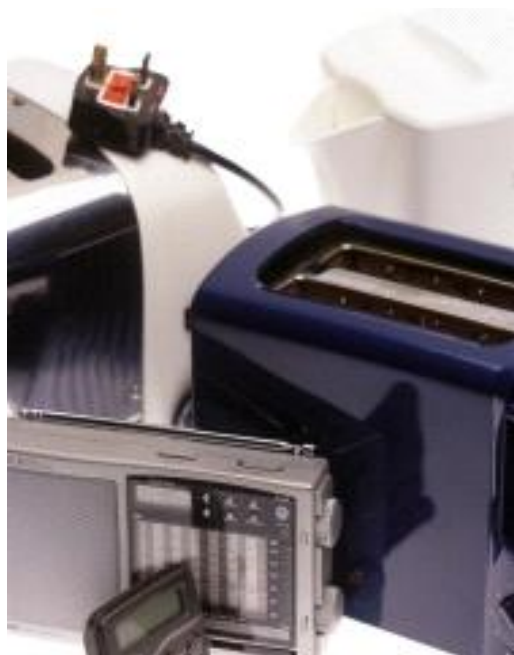
